Introduction

In this booklet I have aggregated the historical records that I have discovered from when the Queensland Section was founded in February 1985, and presented them in a format that I hope is interesting and informative.

Early in 2014 I was given the task of creating an archive on the section website for one of the larger chapters. It quickly became apparent that most of the section's history was being lost due to the way that information on websites is usually maintained. At the end of each year the outdated roster of section and chapter officers would be overwritten with a new roster. The section's corporate memory was being obliterated, not deliberately, but by default. The modern web was behaving like an ancient palimpsest, with old data being erased to make way for the new.

I set out to retrieve as much of the lost history as I could, keeping in mind that the section's 30th anniversary was imminent. Luckily I found an old Queensland Section [website](#) that provided an incomplete list of section and chapter officers. The website also had a treasure trove of links to historical documents and artifacts. Encouraged by this turn of luck I widened my search. To my surprise the data came tumbling in, and I built a sizable repository on the section website to house it.

As well as finding many documents related to the establishment of the section and its chapters I also located newsletters and minutes of meetings. Although the collection of these items is far from complete it includes 94 sets of meeting minutes stretching back to 2005, and 44 newsletters dating to 1997, when the section's first electronic newsletter was published. Prior to 1997 newsletters were circulated by post, meaning that none of them have survived.

The information in this booklet is the most accurate that has been published to date, though it is not complete, especially for the period between 1985 and 2005. The contents of the booklet do not represent all the historical data that I have accumulated in the last year. The section [website](#) contains more information in its archives than is possible to present here. I encourage you to visit it, and I hope you enjoy what is within these pages.

Dear colleagues,

Welcome to IEEE Queensland's 30th Anniversary celebrations.

Thanks to their efforts, we now have an energetic IEEE Queensland team supporting over 1,000 local members. Last year our activities included hosting an Asia-Pacific Satellite Navigation Workshop, a Statistical Signal Processing Workshop, the IEEE Australia & New Zealand Student & Young Professionals

Congress, numerous courses and countless seminars. This year we are holding the IEEE International Conference on Acoustics, Speech and Signal Processing (ICASSP) and the Asia-Pacific Power and Energy Engineering Conference.



In the beginning...

Formal IEEE involvement in Australia occurred with the formation in Sydney of the Australian Section on August 16th 1972.

Steady growth in the following years saw the Australian Section become the New South Wales Section, and the Australia Council was established on May 30th 1986. State-based sections were formed in Victoria and Western Australia in 1983 and 1984 respectively, and Queensland became the fourth Australian IEEE section on February 22nd 1985.

David Thiel joined the IEEE in 1981 after meeting some IEEE members at a conference in Los Angeles in that year. On returning to Australia he observed the formation of state-based sections and decided that Queensland should have a separate section. He approached IEEE's Regional Activities Board and obtained a mailing list for the 250 IEEE members resident in Queensland.

In late 1984 David wrote to the Queensland members advocating the formation of a local section. He received 70 positive responses and submitted a petition to the Regional Activities Board on November 28th 1984.

Approval to form the Queensland Section was granted on February 22nd 1985, with David Thiel in the role of Founding Chair subject to elections for the section's inaugural officers. Shortly thereafter David went overseas on academic leave and the business of getting the section started was delegated to Miles Moody.

The first organisational task facing Miles was to call elections for the various section officers, including section chair. In 1985 this was a time-consuming operation as all correspondence was conducted by post, e-mail being a futuristic notion at the time.

The elections were held on September 16th 1985 and Miles was duly elected chair, at which point he also became the inaugural chair. The first committee meeting took place the following day, but the records of who attended and in what capacity have not survived.

The section was officially launched on February 26th 1986 at a function attended by the Minister for Industry, Small Business and Technology Mike Ahearn. Miles continued in his role as section chair until October 31st 1987.

Mat Darveniza was the third section chair, presiding from November 1st 1987 until December 31st 1989. He returned to the chair in 1997 and served for a further year.

Mat Darveniza is one of the pre-eminent members of the IEEE, both in Australia and internationally. An IEEE Fellow since 1979, he was elected a Life Fellow in 1998. In 1993 Professor Darveniza was awarded the IEEE Herman Halperin Electric Transmission and Distribution Award. He was awarded the IEEE Education Activities Board Meritorious Services Citation in 1995 and the Meritorious Achievement Award in Continuing Education in 1997.

Initially the Queensland Section's geographical area covered all of the state of Queensland plus Papua New Guinea. On January 29th 1994 the North Queensland Section was formed, restricting the Queensland Section's geographical area to those parts of Queensland below the 23rd parallel south.

Senior Members

IEEE Fellows

IEEE Fellow is a distinction reserved for select IEEE members whose extraordinary accomplishments in any of the IEEE fields of interest are deemed fitting of this prestigious grade elevation.

The grade of Fellow first appeared in the American Institute of Electrical Engineers constitution of 1912. In that year, the AIEE revised its membership structure and established the grade of Fellow for those engineers who had demonstrated outstanding proficiency and had achieved distinction in their profession. Potential Fellows had to be at least thirty-two years of age, with a minimum of ten years' experience.

Today the IEEE Grade of Fellow is conferred by the Board of Directors upon a person with an extraordinary record of accomplishments in any of the IEEE fields of interest. The total number selected in any one year does not exceed one-tenth of one percent of the total voting Institute membership.

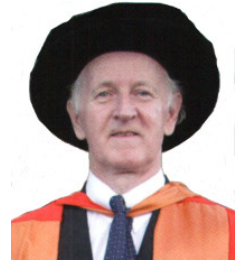
